This course provides hands-on experience in sewing, garment construction, and working with a variety of fabrics and materials. Students will also explore design processes, industry techniques, and safe work practices, building a strong foundation for further study or entry into the fashion and textile industry.

You will learn things like:

- Using sewing machines and hand tools to construct garments and textile products
- Reading and following basic patterns
- Working with different fabrics and materials
- Exploring simple design concepts and creative techniques
- Applying safe work practices in a workshop environment
- Developing teamwork and communication skills through practical projects
